Dayshift broke from briefing for a possible residential burglary in progress. The resident called and believed someone was inside of their residence. While multiple officers were on their way to the residence, the reporting party checked the residence confirmed no one had entered the residence. The rest of the shift was steady with calls. One call to note was a residential burglary in progress. A homeowner was in the process of selling their home and was out of state. Through video surveillance, she saw an unknown male tampering with the back-sliding door and entering her home. Upon arrival, Officers located the suspect leaving in his vehicle. SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

As the graveyard shift rounded out our work week, the officers were kept busy throughout the entirety. In addition to handling calls for service, officers were conducting traffic enforcement stops and contacting suspicious people. These resulted in several arrests for narcotics and warrants. Officers spent some time in the downtown area, patrolling for any issues at the local bars. None were reported. During the middle of the shift, officers responded to a park for a female subject who was sleeping on one of the benches. The officers contacted her and informed her of the park closure, asking her to leave. She became belligerent and aggressive, refusing to leave. Officers realized she was also intoxicated, and were forced to arrest her. During the arrest, she resisted and kicked at least one of the officers. She was arrested and taken to jail.
